Information and Privacy Commission launches e-learning to support privacy and information access legislation in NSW

Chief Executive Officer of the Information and Privacy Commission (IPC) and Information Commissioner for NSW Elizabeth Tydd today launched a new e-learning portal which offers a streamlined and accessible approach to training for NSW privacy and information access legislation.

The IPC e-learning portal will initially provide access to two customised e-learning modules:

- Privacy Complaint Handling
- GIPA Act: Access Training for Decision Makers – Module 1

These e-learning options have been developed specifically to assist right to information and privacy practitioners, and are provided free of charge to all IPC stakeholders via a simple self-registration process.

“These two modules commence an important education and training strategy for the IPC. We are committed to continuing to develop new e-learning modules and educational tools which will be added to the e-learning portal to meet stakeholder demand for training in the areas of government information access and privacy legislation in NSW,” said Ms Tydd.
