Regulatory Plan Initiatives Status

In Quarter 1 2021-22, two initiatives were reassessed and are therefore not included in the finalised Regulatory Initiatives.

In this quarter (Q2 2021/22) of reporting, the IPC finalised 4 (12.1%) of the 33 Regulatory Initiatives.

The IPC's Regulatory Plan commenced in January 2020 and between January 2020 and December 2021, 31 (93.9%) Regulatory Initiatives were finalised and 2 (6.1%) were reassessed. There are no outstanding Regulatory Initiatives, thus concluding the Regulatory Plan 2020-22.
