



# Keep your information safe.

Ideas for you.






They may ask for things like

You may **not** want to say.




You have the right to ask them

- your work place.




- It may be

You get a bill. Like for your water.






You pay the bill.



You want to throw the paid bill out.


### Wait

Do **not** put it in the bin.

Now put it in the bin.








Think about what you post. Like

Ask a person you trust.




You use different websites. Like

- online banking.




Ask a person you trust.

They can help you make them more safe.




Like you use a pass word.

Do **not** tell other people your

- pass words
- PIN numbers. Like your bank PIN.

It is **your** secret number.





You get an email. It looks real.

Like it may say it is from your bank.

It may have the bank logo on it.

But



It is a lie. They want to trick you.


It is **not** from your bank. We call it a scam.



They say they are your bank.

They may ask for your bank pass word.

#### Then



They take all **your** money.




You get an email like this.

You think it is a scam.

Or

You are **not** sure. It may **not** be safe.



Do not send them things about you. Like

- your credit card number
- how old you are
- where you live.



Do **not** tap on things in the email. Like links. These may be words in blue. They take you to a different website.



Call the place that sent the email. Like the email says it is from your bank.

Call your bank.


But



Do **not** use the phone number on this email.

Find a letter they sent you.

Get their phone number from the letter.



Ask them about the email. They can tell you

• the email is safe

or

• the email is **not** safe.

Like you get a new job. You need to send ID.


Like a photo of your

Or




Do it on your phone. Use your phone internet.




Do not use free wi fi. Like




